MINUTES REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 18, 2019 – 8:00 a.m. 233 East Fulton

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Hawkins. Other members present: Vice Chairman Craig VanderWall, Mr. Philip Balkema, Mr. Phillip Mitchell, Ms. Donijo DeJonge, Mr. Nathaniel Moody, and Mr. Robert Veenstra.

Also present: Ms. Peggy Korzen, Executive Director of the Retirement System and Mr. Thomas Michaud, Legal Advisor to the Board.

There were no public comments regarding agenda items.

Moved by Mr. Balkema and seconded by Vice Chairman VanderWall, the following administrative items were approved by the Board of Trustees:

Ms. Korzen next presented a report of Cash Account transfers for the period 10/01/19 - 12/31/19. The Retirement Systems Office staff projected a need for \$3,450,000 to be transferred to the cash account as follows: \$1,150,000 on October 1st, \$1,150,000 on November 1st and \$1,150,000 on December 2nd. Ms. Korzen recommended, and Mr. David Lindberg of Wilshire Associates agreed, making the transfers as follows:

Ms. Korzen presented the Public Act 314 Asset Analysis showing a market value of \$428,458,395 on July 31, 2019. The report was received and filed by the Chairman. (Analysis found on page)

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Ms. Korzen next addressed the 13th Check calculations by noting that the five-year average book value rate of return was 5.08% for the Police & Fire Retirement System. Per City Code, in order for a 13th Check to be issued, the five-year average market value rate of return must exceed 8.0%. Therefore, there are not sufficient reserves to issue a 13th Check on January 31, 2020. The report was received and filed by the Chairman.

There were no public comments on items not on the agenda.

Ms. Korzen noted that the Annual Accounting for the General Retirement System for the period 07/01/18 - 06/30/19 was ready to be reviewed. She noted that it was decided by Trustees to review the Annual Accountings of both retirement systems at the same time each year, and therefore a committee should be established. Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Veenstra volunteered to serve. Chairman Hawkins noted that Ms. Korzen will coordinate a date to review the accountings and the Trustees will report their findings to the Board at a future Board meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 8:03 a.m.
